

Message from Dean

This past Academic Year 2008/09 has been one of transition and adaptation to new systems and paradigms. It saw the further development of the National University Health System (NUHS) tri-mission of Excellence in Clinical Care, Translational Research and Education of an Academic Health Centre (AHC) with the formation of the NUHS University Dental Cluster and the integration of the tri-mission with Dentistry, strengthening the role and interconnectedness of Oral Health in the delivery of healthcare in Singapore.

The four critical platforms indentified by NUHS to achieve the desired synergies across Clinical Care, Research and Education are 1) integrated strategic planning, 2) one common budget and resource allocation system; 3) harmonised HR framework and 4) integrated space management. Much steady progress has been made over the past year in all of these areas with HR harmonisation for Executive and Professional staff as well as Clinicians / Academic staff achieved. Behind the scenes, strategic planning is conducted across the 3 entities and there is steady progress towards a common budget and resource allocation system, with the aim of mission-based budgeting.

Integrated space management has, as one of the first visible signs of infrastructure redevelopment on campus for the AHC tri-mission, the relocation of most of the teaching and clinical training facilities as well as administrative offices of the Faculty to the Interim Building located at the former NUS Carpark 9. This partial relocation of the Faculty allows more direct public access of medical clinical services (National University Heart Centre, Singapore - NUHCS) at the NUH Main Building from the Kent Ridge MRT Station as well as the consolidation and modest expansion of Dental Services for the University Dental Cluster. The design team and project committee, ably led by A/Prof Keng Siong Beng, have been hard at work in the design, planning and execution of this new 6195 m2 GFA facility since the latter half of 2008. From the commencement of construction on 3 June, 2009, progress has been rapid with round the clock works, and the building is well on track to it's targeted opening by January 2010. The Faculty looks forward beyond that milestone to a planned permanent single-site facility that will eventually house all the Education, Research and Service facilities of Dentistry under the NUHS system.

The Departments of Restorative Dentistry and Preventive Dentistry hosted Department Visiting Committees in January and March 2009 respectively. Internationally-renown academics reviewed the status of both departments in the AHC tri-mission, benchmarking and assessing their performance and making recommendations for future areas of development and focus. I am happy to report that both departments performed well and have formulated action plans for their further development.



In a reprise of the SARS crisis of 2003, this past year also saw the H1N1 Influenza pandemic challenge which again stress-tested our business continuity plans and clinical operational workflows and policies. The SARS experience stood us well and cooperation and adaptability of all staff and students allowed us to pass through this challenge smoothly.

2009 is the 80th Anniversary Year of the Faculty, and a series of celebratory events were planned throughout the year, to culminate in the Gala Dinner finale at the end of the year. As the Faculty expands its intake in the coming years beyond the current undergraduate class size of 48, we expect the number of needy students to increase. With the prevailing climate of great uncertainty in the global economic outlook, it was identified that a most worthy cause to rally around during this challenging and extraordinary Anniversary Year was a bursary fund for needy students and the Faculty therefore launched the 80th Anniversary Bursary Fund. I am happy to report that the response to the call for donations from Alumni, Donors and Friends has been outstanding and we are well on our way to reaching our target of raising \$0.5 M (before government matching) for student bursaries in this 80th Anniversary Year Campaign. A large proportion of this target sum came from gifts of \$257K from the World Dental Education Society (WDES) to set up the WDES-FDI Bursary and \$125K from the Lee Foundation. The WDES-FDI Bursary will be endowed fund of \$0.5M (with government matching) to support 2 financially needy students annually with bursaries of \$8,000 each. This will be the largest bursary yet created and available for our Dentistry undergraduates. To all donors, alumni and staff who have contributed - our greatest Appreciation and Thanks for your tremendous support and generosity!

Let me repeat the call I made during this 80th Anniversary Year of the Faculty:

What does the next 80 years hold in store for the Faculty? Whatever it may be, this NUS Dentistry Spirit will Empower it. Let Us Look Forward to another 80 Years of Excellence in Dental Education, Research and Service, for Singapore, and Help Us produce the coming Generations of Dental Graduates who we hope will continue to make their mark on Society and Community.



The Faculty will be guided by eight objectives to achieve our Vision to be a dental institution of international distinction:


- To be the educational hub for dentistry in the region, a confluence where the very best dental students, staff and faculty interact and learn from one another.

Faculty's Strategic Plans

An Update

Faculty had identified its main strategic priorities:

RESEARCH

The 3 core research centres - Centre for Craniofacial and Regenerative Biology (CCRB), Dental Biophotonics and Biomaterials Programme (DBBP) and Craniofacial Clinical Research Unit (CCRU) have seen promising progress in research development over the past year, garnering various awards and recognition. This is in line with achieving Faculty's Research Mission to improve oral, dental and craniofacial health and delivery of clinical care.

GRADUATE RESIDENCY TRAINING PROGRAMMES

This year's intake moves the Faculty closer towards its objective of being the regional centre for clinical specialty training. The Faculty accepted a total of 10 new residents for the Master of Dental Surgery Programmes, including 3 residents for Endodontics, 1 for Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, 3 for Orthodontics, 2 for Periodontology and 1 for Prosthodontics.

CENTRE FOR ADVANCED DENTAL EDUCATION (CADE)

CADE continues to raise the profile of continuing education with its second intake of 5 students for the 2-year part-time course leading to a Graduate Diploma in Dental Implantology (GDDI).

Tri-Faculty 80th Anniversary Bash

On 27 February 2009, 3 Faculties (Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences, Faculty of Dentistry and Faculty of Science) came together at the newly constructed Shaw Foundation Alumni House to commemorate their 80th Anniversaries. The trifaculty celebration, graced by NUS President Tan Chorh Chuan, coincided with the launch of the Faculty square, located at the open space Alumni Terrace, which houses 11 Faculty Sculptures, each of which was unveiled by their respective Deans.

The FOD's sculpture, entitled 'Simplicity' was unveiled by our Dean, Associate Professor Keson Tan at this event. The sculpture is the result of an interactive carving



effort involving the students (Chan Wai Seng, Hoo Swee Tiang, Irene Leong, Lim Lizhen, Cara Teo Xingru, Ode Wataru and Zhuang Ronglin) and staff, and was done under the guidance of sculptor Chong Fah Cheong.

NUS Safety & Health Improvement Projects (SHIP) Scheme 2008 - Safetymation

The team, "The Lifesavers!" from the Faculty of Dentistry, comprising of Mdm Tan Sok Lan from Lab 2, and Aramia Tee, Albert Lee, Kelvin Chua, Syazwan Lim and Chan Boon Hui, all from the Class of 2011, won the Silver Award in the inaugural 'Safetymation' competition 2008; organized by the Office of Safety, Health & Environment (OSHE).

The team made a short video clip to bring across the message "Be Safe, Not Sorry." The aim of the video was to identify and educate users of the dental laboratory about the various aspects of safety in the laboratory,

which are easy to overlook, but causes tremendous consequences when accidents occur. The aspects identified were: Sharps injuries, chemical safety, safe usage of rotary instruments, proper personal protective equipment, and last but not least, fire safety.






The New Faculty of Dentistry Building

Even as early as late 2007 there were initial discussions plans for a possible offsite rental space for a FOD move but the plan did not materialized because of cost and inconvenience.

With the recent developments of the health care sector and the National University Health System (NUHS) and the need for hospital's expansion plans, faculty was asked to consider a shift to a new site. This was further expedited because of the planned opening of the MRT station at Kent Ridge in 2010.

Part of the teaching facilities would still remain at the current level 2 and level 4 of the FOD building at NUH. The dental services for NUHS will continue to be provided at the present Dental Centre at Level 1 and a renovated new clinic at Level 2.

Initial plans were drawn up by the OED architects and planners and by late December 2008 the form and shape of the Faculty building was beginning to be a reality. Dean A/P Keson Tan appointed a coordinating secretariat chaired by A/P SB Keng to help NUSOED and the architect planner, Parsons Brinkerhoff in the planning and implementation of the project. Initially 3 concept plans (option A, B, C) were considered and option A was chosen due to cost and simplicity in design. These plans were further refined in Jan-March 2009 and approval was given for the building in late Feb after which a tender was called.

The new FOD building to be Located at the corner between Medical Drive and Lower Kent Ridge Road, occupies the lot used as NUS Car-Park 9 fronting existing Medicine MD 9 and 10 blocks and LT29 and LT28. It is also within short walking distance from two bus stops and the Kent Ridge MRT station. The vehicular traffic flow into the building complex will be from the Lower Kent Ridge Road turning into an internal road of the building.

The 3 storey building will occupy approximately 6195 sq m GFA area and is designed as a double wing with a curved central area

connecting the inner and outer wing with a shape liked an "A" building. The two wings are linked by covered aero-bridges at the 2nd and 3rd levels. A 4th storey roof top on the outer wing will house an open covered area for recreation, student lounge and tutorial rooms.

Level 1 will house the administrative offices on the outer wing while the inner wing incorporates the academic staff rooms. An inner open courtyard with covered sheltered tables and seats straddles the area between the two wings.

The premise on which the building is designed is to keep students movements between the laboratory and the clinics to a minimum. Level 2 and level 3 will house the general student clinic, while a graduate clinic will be located on level 2 including a general student and a graduate Lab. The simulation lab will be at level 3 including a general student lab.

For general imaging and dental radiographic services, these are provided on the outer wing of level 2 with its own reception area. To service the student clinical area, x-ray facilities will also be provided in one of the room in each of the general student clinics.

Access to Level 4 (outer wing) will be by lift from the main entrance foyer or staircase from level 3. The lift opens into a covered lobby situated next to the student lounge rooms. This recreation roof-top area will have a covered section with plants and shrubs to enhance the atmosphere of this area. It will also provide a panoramic view of the expressway. Covered tables and seats will be placed to further enhance the environment for student and staff interaction at this roof-top level.

The overall project development of the Faculty of Dentistry building was coordinated by the Office of Estate Development of NUS and is scheduled for completion in end 2009. Faculty intends to be operational in the new building by January 2010.





Dental Care for the Elderly Project

As part of the Tampines Together program to help elderly cope with the cost of living and to ensure their holistic well-being during the current economic downturn, 250 needy elderly from Tampines received free dental checks and basic dental treatment from 15-19 June 2009 at the Dental Care for Elderly project. The project was launched by Minister for National Development, Mr. Mah Bow Tan and MPs for Tampines GRC Ms. Irene Ng and Mr. Sin Boon Ann.

During the program, hygienists and dental officers from HPB provided scaling, polishing and simple restorations for the elderly while 3rd and 4th year

students from the faculty, under the supervision of faculty staff Dr.AndrewOwandDr.IntekhabIslam, provided free extractions for those who required them. After the check up and basic treatment, elderly who needed follow-up treatment were given NECDC's Neighbourhood Dental Assistance Scheme (NDAS) vouchers to visit the nearby dental clinics to complete their treatment.

The project was spearheaded by Tampines Grassroots Organizations with support from North East Community Development Council (NECDC), Health Promotion Board (HPB) and the Faculty of Dentistry.





Tay Teck Eng Dental Bursary

In early 2008 faculty received a gift of \$45,000 to set up the Tay Teck Eng Dental Bursary. It was established to honour the late Dr Tay Teck Eng who was among the first batch of FoD alumnus to graduate from the Faculty. The funds are contribution from his family and friends.





Mouth Cancer Awareness Campaign



The Mouth Cancer Awareness Week was co-organised by the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and with the Association of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons (Singapore), from the 24th to 29th November 2008.

Its aims were to raise awareness of the devastating consequences of late detection of oral cancer and to educate the public on how early diagnosis holds the key to improved care and treatment outcomes. The activities specially lined up for the event included public lecturers at the NUH Health Education Hub, a public forum, an open house and free mouth cancer/oral health screening run by the department and many of the dental clinics throughout the island.

In the public forum and the SDA talk, the Singapore public was introduced for the first time to the method of oral self examination which has been proven to help early detection of oral cancer and hence improve survival.

Influenza A (H1N1) Measures at Faculty

Singapore turned DORSCON Orange on 1st May 2009, barely 3 days after it stepped up from DORSCON Green to Yellow. The swift but critical action was taken due to reports of high fatality rates from the initial reports in Mexico. As the public and medical profile of the new virus grew, together with the lessons learnt from SARS, stringent measures were undertaken in hospitals to prevent secondary infections within the hospitals, even when there were no known infections in Singapore. For example, medical professionals were barred from moving between healthcare institutions, and staff returning from affected areas had to take a nasopharyngeal swab before they could enter the hospital.


At the Faculty of Dentistry, the staff contact list was promptly updated and submitted to the HR department and the Faculty Crisis Management Team contact list was also updated. In Dental Clinics, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) - N95 mask surgical mask, disposable gowns and caps, disposable gloves, goggles – were stocked up to ensure all staff were properly protected at different alert levels. Temperature records were maintained and everyone was required to report their own temperature twice a day. All the staff and students were also mask-fitted, taught how to wear their PPE, and educated and tested on hand hygiene.

Clinical training was suspended for a week, while undergraduate didactic programmes carried on with implemented ring-fencing. Training attachments were also cancelled. Examinations venues were changed to adhere to university protocols.

HAND HYGIENE CAMPAIGN

A handwashing campaign was conducted from 8th to 12th June with a team led by Clinic Manager, Ms Ng Gek Lang and Nurse, Ms Lim Ai Chin. Students and staff were first educated on the proper method of hand washing, then they were tested to determine that they had adequately learnt the skill. Hand washing was carried out, after which hands were screened under UV light and when it was deemed acceptable, they were awarded with the hand washing sticker.

Associate Professor Chris Sissons



He has developed a unique laboratory dental plaque model ecosystem system, a sophisticated 'Artificial Mouth' with a range of novel molecular plaque analysis techniques and established the study of plaque 'microcosm biofilms.' These enable a wide range of environmentally-controlled experiments into plaque ecology and pathology.

Major studies include effects of fluoride, antimicrobials on the oral microbiota, and plaque anticaries mineralization. He was invited as Visiting Associate Professor from 1st March 2009 to 29th March 2009.

Professor George K.B. Sandor is the Head of Department and Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto as well as Director, Graduate Program in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. 




