While we celebrate our progress, we are happy to also honour the successes and achievements of our colleagues who have propelled our standards in education and research and were duly presented prestigious awards for their efforts.

Our achievements, despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, are a testament of everyone's tireless efforts and contributions towards helping the Faculty achieve its mission.

Professor Patrick Finbarr Allen's Farewell

Professor Patrick Finbarr Allen concluded his deanship with the Faculty in June 2022.

In his role as Dean of the Faculty, Prof Allen steered the Faculty to greater heights across the domains of Education, Research and Clinical Services. He was a great supporter of innovation and discovery, constantly providing guidance and encouragement for the Faculty to explore new ways of delivering dental education, research solutions and clinical care to meet the evolving needs of the population. Some examples include launching the Oral Care, Health Innovations and Designs Singapore (ORCHIDS) research centre to support the development of new concepts and technologies in dentistry, co-leading the National Adult Oral Health Survey to analyse the implications of individual lifestyles and habits on overall wellbeing and establishing DentAlliance, a network of four dental schools to advance and transform research, education and practice in dentistry internationally.

Prof Allen also concluded his appointment as Director of the National University Centre for Oral Health, Singapore (NUCOHS) on 30 November 2021. As Director, NUCOHS, Prof Allen was pivotal in elevating the level of oral health services offered in NUCOHS. The national centre thus saw its patient attendance increasing since its official opening in FY19. It also consistently achieved high ratings in the Patient Experience Survey since 2020.

Associate Professor Patrick Tseng succeeded Prof Allen as the new Director NUCOHS from 1 December 2021. Dr Wendy Wang was also appointed to the role of Deputy Director, NUCOHS while Associate Professor Wong Mun Loke assumed the role of Acting Dean for the Faculty from 1 December 2021.

Congratulations to our award recipients. Thank you for keeping the Faculty's flag flying high.

Associate Professor Fu Jia Hui (left) was conferred the NUS Annual Teaching Excellence Award 2022 while Dr Lim Li Zhen's (right) team achieved the NUS Annual Digital Education Award (ADEA) 2022. Assoc Prof Fu and Dr Lim were recognised for their efforts in infusing innovative pedagogies such as the use of technology to enhance students' Periodontology learning of and Oral Radiology respectively.





Assistant Professor Nileshkumar Dubey and his team were awarded one of the three winning initiatives at the Interstellar Initiative 2021-22 for their project on the development of a non-invasive saliva biomarker to detect cardiovascular disease. The award recognises the world's most promising Early Career Investigators and provides incentives and opportunities to connect peers from related but distinct disciplines to address global societal challenges.

MPhil student Ms Priti Pragati Rath won the International Association for Dental Research (IADR) / KULZER Travel Award for her work on Solid Lipid Nanoparticles (SLN) carrying Acyclovir, a low soluble drug. The solution based SLN allows the slow release of the drug Acyclovir to treat Herpes Simplex Virus (HSV). This decreases the frequency of intake of the drug per day, reducing chances of chronic toxicity in individuals while maintaining its effectiveness.



Her winning project enables patients to use fuss-free intra-oral scans to review their dental health via their smartphones.





Dr Gabriel Lee won the International Association for Dental Research Geriatric Oral Research Group (IADR GORG) Pre-doctoral Award at the IADR 2022 conference with his research topic, "Facilitators of Nursing Home Oral Healthcare in Singapore: Dentists' Perspectives". Through his research, Dr Lee hopes to establish a better system of finance and dental resources to enhance oral healthcare in nursing homes.

Ms Shen Jia Jing, a third-year Bachelor of Dental Surgery student, won the 2022 European Federation of Periodontology (EFP) Undergraduate Essay Writing Competition around the topic "How can the clinical practice and science of periodontology be developed to ensure environmental sustainability?" Dental Screening and Health Education for Migrant Workers

The Faculty engaged the migrant worker community through a range of activities. These included a collaboration with HealthServe and Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health (SSHSPH) as well as another one with the Ministry of Manpower's Assurance, Care and Engagement (ACE) group. Staff, students and alumni made their way to Terusan Recreation Centre (collaboration with HealthServe and SSHSPH) as well as Penjuru and Cochrane Recreation Centres (collaboration with MOM ACE) in May and September 2022 respectively.





Through these activities, over 600 migrant workers received an oral health screening followed by oral health education. The undergraduate students proactively offered the migrant workers advice about brushing, flossing and maintaining healthy lifestyle habits.

"As we did not have the best facilities and lighting at the screening event, we had to rely solely on clinical signs and symptoms to diagnose each worker's dental conditions fairly so they could receive proper treatment. The language barrier also challenged our communication skills - verbal and non-verbal - to deliver care and reassurance to our patients. The screening exposes us to a population that we rarely come across in our daily practice due to the high cost of care and makes us realise that treatment needs are actually much higher than what it is in our working environments," shared alumna Dr Joey Lee.


On top of going all out to garner donations from the public through the Flag campaign, students also put up a vibrant performance at the Rag Day held on 6 August 2022.

Parents' Webinar: A Head Start for Healthier Teeth

Parents from PCF Sparkletots Sengkang attended a webinar titled "A Head Start for Healthier Teeth" conducted by our alumna and Paediatric Dentistry Registrar at the National University Centre for Oral Health Singapore (NUCOHS) Dr Jeannette Chua on 3 September 2022.

At the session, parents gained valuable insights on some common oral issues among young children and learned more about how they could care for their children's teeth through toothbrushing, avoiding unhealthy feeding practices, maintaining good oral hygiene habits and consuming a healthy diet.



My First Skool Oral Health Outreach





The Faculty organised an outreach session at My First Skool (Blk 54 Chin Swee Road) on 5 September 2022. The visit titled, 'My First Skool Oral Health Outreach 2022' was conducted by three of our alumni, Dr Ishreen Kaur Dhillon, Dr Quak Su Lin and Dr Gan Joe Yin.

Through captivating storytelling, colouring activities and more, the visit brought dentistry to life by demonstrating how dental tools are used and how visits to the dentists are conducted. Pre-schoolers also learned how to care for their teeth and practise healthy oral habits such as good toothbrushing techniques.

"Toothbrushing twice a day with a fluoridated toothpaste and reducing the consumption of sugar containing snacks were important takeaways from this preschool outreach programme. Awareness at an early age can develop good oral habits that can last a lifetime!" shared Dr Ishreen.

Basic Course in Dental Implantology (Series 1)

The Faculty conducted the Basic Course in Dental Implantology (Series 1) from 4 July to 2 September 2022.

The course helped participants to understand more about dental implants as a treatment option. Besides gaining theoretical knowledge, participants also learned to apply their skills through hands-on sessions.



Mental Resilience Talk

Mr Johnathan Chew, our third-year dental student and Ms Teh Yen Ceen, Learning Partner Manager at NUS Office of Health and Wellbeing gave a talk about the importance of maintaining good mental wellness on 28 September 2022.

Mr Chew, who was crowned champion of MasterChef Singapore Season Three, reflected on how he coped with stress before, during and after the competition. He highlighted three key points: Take breaks when needed; Stay prepared; Take criticisms in your stride.

He said, "It is important to figure out which criticisms are constructive and which are not. In this day and age, it is so easy for people to give a negative feedback if they do not like you. If you know that you have already done your due diligence and delivered to the best of your ability, there is no need to be too bothered or stressed by what others think or say."





Ms Teh went on to share with participants a life stress inventory test where they could evaluate their stress level. She also elaborated on some useful resilient practices that could be used to help cope with stress.

She added, "We want to manage our expectations in life that things do happen but we can control how we respond to them... Catch yourself in situations where you are surrounded by negativity and try to reframe them." Rather than focus on negativity, it's important to see each challenge as a learning point in life, she shared.

The talk concluded with a question and answer session where participants got the opportunity to ask speakers how they could enhance their mental wellness and understand more about reaching out to wellbeing specialists in NUS.


Dentistry Step Challenge 1 - 31 October 2022
