

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In Loving Memory of Associate Professor Jennifer Meo



Your friendship will be treasured in our hearts and your legacy will live on forever

It is with a heavy heart that we mourn the sudden passing of our dear colleague and friend, Associate Professor Jennifer Neo, on 25 December 2022. A mentor and leader in the truest sense of words, Assoc Prof Neo's legacy will live on in the hearts and minds of those she inspired. Though she may no longer be with us, her impact on the dental community will endure for many years.



Dr Tan Hee Hon, Assistant Dean (Clinical Phase), reflected that "Assoc Prof Neo was a genuine teacher and friend; she would always lend a listening ear and give advice from the bottom of her heart by checking on our progress - personal or professional. We will miss the creak produced by her high heel shoes, and we will be sure to follow her "steps" to make the Faculty of Dentistry a better place to learn and practise dentistry."

During her distinguished 40-year career with the university, Assoc Prof Neo held several key appointments in the Faculty, including Vice Dean, Research (1995 - 2001); Vice Dean, Clinical Affairs (2010 - 2012); Director, Division of Graduate Dental Studies (2013 - 2016); Director, Discipline of Endodontics, Operative Dentistry and Prosthodontics (2011-2020); Head, Department of Restorative Dentistry (2001-2011) and Module Coordinator, Operative Dentistry (1990-2020).

Apart from her senior management roles, Assoc Prof Neo generously shared her expertise and experience to continuously shape the undergraduate dental curriculum. Her passion for education was evident, and she inspired many colleagues to become excellent educators too.

Beyond the Faculty, Assoc Prof Neo was engaged in University-wide initiatives such as the NUS Institutional Review Board (IRB). At the national level, she flew the Faculty's flag high and served on numerous committees such as the Singapore Dental Council's Complaints Committee, Disciplinary Committee, Continuing Professional Education Sub-Committee and Credentials Sub-Committee as well as MOH Dental Specialists Accreditation Board.

In recognition of her unwavering dedication to the Faculty and the wider healthcare community, Assoc Prof Neo was presented the National Day Award - Public Administration (Bronze) Medal by then President of Singapore, Dr Tony Tan, in 2011. In 2016, she also received the National Day Award - The Long Service Medal (40 years).

With her expertise in healthcare and dentistry, Assoc Prof Neo played an integral part in the planning, design and conceptualisation of the National University Centre for Oral Health, Singapore - a National Dental Specialty Centre which synergises clinical services, education and research facilities under one roof.

Former Dean of NUS Faculty of Dentistry, Emeritus Prof Chew Chong Lin, shared, "Assoc Prof Neo dedicated the greater part of her life to training, preparing, and guiding students at the Faculty. Her kindness, generosity, and caring nature won the respect of all. We have lost a great friend, and I will always be thankful for her friendship, support and her hand in setting up a bursary in my honour."



With Assoc Prof Neo's passing, it is unmistakable that the dental community has lost a devoted mentor, a front-runner of progress and a dedicated colleague. For those who knew her, Assoc Prof Neo was a passionate teacher and a caring clinician.

Dr Tan Ming Yi, an alumna of the Faculty, recollected that "Assoc Prof Neo was more than a mentor. On my graduation day, she greeted me with a bouquet of fresh flowers and a big, heartfelt hug. With tears in her eyes, she described how graduation season was an emotional time for her as she treated her students like her own children. She always truly cared for her students, and that deeply moved me."

Assoc Prof Jennifer Neo leaves a lasting impression and an incomparable legacy in our hearts. Farewell, our teacher, mentor, colleague, and close friend. You will be dearly missed.

Congratulations to our award recipients



Dr Nicholas Lim was presented the Asian Academy of Prosthodontics 2022 Korean Academy of Prosthodontics award on Erosive Tooth Wear (ETW) among Young Soldiers in Singapore

Appreciating the costs and complexity of rehabilitating patients with severe generalised ETW and realising a lack of epidemiological data on the condition, Dr Nicholas Lim embarked on a study to determine the prevalence of ETW and its associated risk factors among young soldiers in Singapore.

This study, which was conducted as part of his Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) programme, paves the way for further studies in ETW for the larger population.

"It is fortunate that we can provide timely dental education and increase awareness to this population to limit the rate of wear, which will ultimately affect them in later life. If you can prevent it early, why not?" said Dr Lim.

Dr Wan Hui Wei was awarded Second Runner-up for a presentation on Peri-implant Mucositis Treatment

Held from 28 to 30 November 2022 at the Bangkok International Symposium of Implant Dentistry (BIS), third-year Periodontics postgraduate Dr Wan Hui Wei addressed the use of chemotherapeutics and how it improves treatment outcomes for peri-implant mucositis. With the theme of 'Change and Challenges in Implant Dentistry', Dr Wan performed a systematic review and network meta-analysis on her Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) thesis to investigate the research question.



Dr Wan explained, "As this was my first time participating in a poster presentation, I am very thankful to be awarded the second runner-up prize. This research project would not have been possible without the support of the Faculty."

Students awarded Team and Encouragement Award under the mentorship of Dr Nilesh Dubey

Led by Dr Nilesh Dubey, National University of Singapore (NUS) High School students won the Team Award and the Encouragement Award at the Sembcorp Marine's Green Wave Environmental Care Competition for the project titled "Sustainable Nanofibrous Scaffold for Dental Tissue Engineering."

This project explores the possibility of using bacterial nanocellulose as a substitute for synthetic materials in tissue engineering applications. The biodegradable material is considered eco-friendlier and more sustainable. This research explores the potential application of nanocellulose in the oral health consumer market, moving beyond laboratory settings.

Director of NUCOHS, Associate Professor Patrick Tseng, shared, "The 5th ETMH Distinguished Speaker Programme was enlightening and eye-opening. Dr Audrey Yoon offered attendees good insights into OSA by balancing scientific research with clear clinical evidence. The knowledge gained from the programme will help dentists (working in a multidisciplinary team) identify, treat and manage airway disorders from infants to adults."

The Faculty hosted the 5th ETMH Distinguished Speaker Programme at the National University Centre for Oral Health, Singapore (NUCOHS) from 27 to 29 November 2022. Around 230 participants attended the event. We welcomed Dr Audrey Yoon, an outstanding orthodontist dentist with paediatric extensive and credentials, as our distinguished speaker. Dr Yoon shared her knowledge on managing Obstructive Sleep Apnoea (OSA) from infant to adult and conducted a workshop on MARPE (Mini-Screw assisted Rapid Palatal Expander). This programme helped participants to increase their awareness of OSA and the available treatment options.





Honouring our Donors at the Donor Appreciation Night 2022








DentAlliance Symposium: Celebrating Achievements and Developing Strategies for Oral Health Advancement




Dental Deans and representatives from the Adams School of Dentistry (The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill); the Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences (King's College London); the Melbourne Dental School (University of Melbourne); and the Faculty of Dentistry (National University of Singapore) gathered to present the DentAlliance's accomplishments and future goals at a virtual symposium held on 18 October 2022. Over 100 participants tuned in to the event.



During the session, participants learned more about DentAlliance's goals, current activities, and planned programmes, in which they were encouraged to post questions to representatives from the four dental schools. Acting Dean, Associate Professor Wong Mun Loke concluded the webinar by discussing how public health challenges have developed and how DentAlliance hopes to transform the discipline of dentistry in the face of rapid changes.

Assoc Prof Wong explained, "Over the last two years, we have faced a myriad of changes – changes in population demographics, the emergence of public health threats as we have seen through the COVID-19 pandemic, the evolution of innovations in education or clinical care, the advancement of technology, the use of big data to manage health and more... Amidst these changes, we need to rethink, reimage and reposition dentistry for the future whether it is in terms of education, research or clinical care... The power of collaboration, as exhibited through DentAlliance, cannot be underestimated, and this network which we are all a part of will allow us to tap into the various areas of excellence that we each possess and transform these into meaningful partnerships that will make a difference in dentistry."



Dentalliance has four workgroups: Research and Innovation, Education, Continuing Professional Development and Addressing Global Inequalities.



An Amazing Walk


Walking has been proven to help decrease the risk of heart disease and strengthen bones and muscles. It also improves mood and reduces stress.


As such, a walk was organised on 10 February 2023 for staff to take a leisurely walk around the NUS campus to boost their mental health. In total, participants walked almost 7km.
