DEAN'S MESSAGE

Dear alumni, donors and valued partners

As we look back on 2021, we remember the many challenges we encountered as we continued to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Amidst the many changes to the status quo and uncertainties, the Faculty was able to stay the course in its mission of education, research and clinical services.

In fact, we also had much to celebrate as the Faculty launched ORCHIDS - Oral Care, Health Innovations and Designs Singapore. This new research centre staffed by a multi-disciplinary team of basic and clinician scientists will continue to advance research in Dentistry and looks forward to embark on world-class innovations across the fields of microbiology, nanomaterials, regenerative medicine, 3D-printing technologies and health devices. Through the work of ORCHIDS, the Faculty strives to impact the delivery of clinical care and adoption of personalised oral health care.

On the education front, the Faculty continued to adopt new methods of teaching and leverage technology to advance its undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing education programmes. Collaborative partnerships with international dental schools continued to grow with Kings College London, Adams School of Dentistry [University of North Carolina] and University of Melbourne through the DentAlliance Network. Together, we rolled out several new programmes such as the virtual undergraduate student exchange; continuing professional education workshops as well as an online research networking session.

The Faculty hosted the International Advisory Panel in the last quarter of 2021 as part of ongoing efforts to benchmark its education and research with international standards. A virtual tour of the Faculty and a series of online meetings with key Faculty stakeholders were organised for the Panel. At the end of the visit, the Panel, comprising leaders in dental education from around the world, was impressed by the achievements and work of the Faculty over the last few years. It also offered recommendations for the Faculty to consider in its future plans to bring it to greater heights.

The Faculty's achievements would not have been possible without the collective commitment and hard work of its dedicated team of full and part-time staff, as well as the strong support of alumni, donors and partners. The Faculty is deeply thankful and grateful for the generosity of our alumni, donors and partners. Through their giving, it has helped the Faculty anchor various meaningful initiatives including the provision of financial aid for our students; recognition of academic excellence; enrichment of student life; roll-out of continuing education and conduct of impactful research. These contributions go a long way to help the Faculty achieve its vision and mission. A significant milestone for the Faculty in 2021 was the set-up of the Chew Chong Lin Dental Bursary led by Associate Professor Jennifer Neo. Research

The SDA Endowment Fund has enabled us to reach out to more than 650 parents and caregivers of persons with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities in Singapore.

Through this study, we have gathered important information on the dietary patterns, oral health practices and utilisation of dental services among persons with disabilities, as well as the barriers they face in seeking dental care. This has enabled us to engage key stakeholders to improve the oral health of persons with disabilities.

In our study, we found that Silver Diamine Fluoride, an increasingly important material to control cavities, can be potentially toxic to dental cells in certain conditions. This will lead to future research into optimising the formulation or setting clinical protocols to ensure the safe usage of this material

CHEW CHONG LIN DENTAL BURSARY

A new NUS bursary will put gleaming smiles on aspiring dentists' faces. The Chew Chong Lin Dental Bursary will provide financial aid to dentistry undergraduates, and address their teething problems in their journey to become full-fledged dentists.

"Prof Chew wanted to raise funds for the undergraduate students. They make up the foundation of the dentists in our nation, as we are the only dental school in Singapore. The tuition fees for Dentistry, currently at \$\$29,300 per annum, is the same as that for the Medical Faculty and is the highest of all the courses at NUS.

It would be great to assist financially strapped students who have to contend with this burden whilst undergoing their studies in the dental course. Prof Chew himself came from a family who had to come together to pool their savings to send him to dental school," shared Prof Neo.

"I personally called up 95 per cent of the contacts I had on my mobile and their response for Prof Chew was overwhelming. Big or small, the gifts were a testimony of the respect for him. The bulk of the gifts came from his former dental students, overseas dentists, medical colleagues and personal friends," revealed the dental academic, who has fond memories working alongside Prof Chew at the Faculty.



The altruistic idea for the Bursary was inspired by Emeritus Professor Chew Chong Lin, and initiated by Associate Professor Jennifer Neo. Both are professors and alumni of the NUS Faculty of Dentistry.

Armed with a big heart, a can-do spirit and a contact list, Prof Neo reached out to over 160 alumni and friends, who jointly contributed over \$\$800,000 to date.

Prof Chew is regarded as the doyen of dentistry in Singapore. An educator, practitioner and public servant, he has made indelible contributions over 45 years — from teaching students in classrooms to treating patients in clinics, and from conducting impactful research to formulating public policies.

His outstanding leadership did not go unnoticed and he went on to assume senior appointments in the various divisions within the Ministry of Health, such as Deputy Director of Medical Services (Dental), President of the Singapore Dental Council (2009-2021), and Chair of the Planning Committee, to oversee the setup of the National Dental Centre (1989 -1995).

Prof Chew's illustrious career has come full circle at NUS. He trained to be a dentist and graduated in 1971 with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery at the then University of Singapore, which later became NUS. Subsequently, he returned to mentor Dentistry students and took on several key appointments at the University, including Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry (1995 - 2000). Today, Prof Chew has a student bursary named in his honour at the Faculty where it all began.

"Never in my dreams did I expect a bursary to be set up in my honour. I am humbled by their very generous gesture and am overwhelmed by the amount they have raised to establish this Bursary. I am very grateful. It is comforting to know that we have successful and caring dental professionals.

This Bursary was established to provide help to students who need financial assistance. I am happy that this Bursary is set up as an endowed fund, so that more students will benefit from this fund annually, which will help them to successfully complete their training. When they start their practice, I hope they will generously contribute to the financial need of future students and remember our alma mater," shared Prof Chew, expressing his gratitude towards fellow Faculty members, alumni and friends who had contributed to the Bursary.
