

A clear learning point for us through the pandemic has been to "expect the unexpected", and develop increased resilience in the face of adversity. Life post pandemic will be different, but there are opportunities for us to grasp. For example, in higher education, we will now make online learning part of our routine and further embrace technology to enhance learning. We will also develop new lines of research to address the issue of safely practicing dentistry in a pandemic. As well as our remit to serve Singapore, it is now clear that we all need to work with global partners to address challenges which are global in nature.

As we look to the future, the Faculty strives to raise the quality of its research output and global impact whilst delivering high-quality education. We are establishing a new centre for Oral Health research which will enhance research capability in the Faculty and ultimately, credibility in seeking external research collaborations. With your support, we can ensure that the research will be at a meaningful scale and have a deep impact. We are conducting a thorough review and reform of our Bachelor of Dental Surgery curriculum to ensure that the next generation of dental practitioners is well placed to manage an aging population with complex medical conditions and dental needs. The Faculty is also working to provide more substantial training opportunities in advanced general dental practice and contributions to lifelong learning. In October 2020, the Faculty established an international collaborative alliance with three of the world's top dental schools: Kings College London, Adams School of Dentistry [University of North Carolina], and University of Melbourne. This alliance will work collaboratively to enhance the standing of all partners and enable us to innovate in research and education at a scale that none of us can do alone.

All of these initiatives can only thrive with support from you, our alumni, donors and valued partners. With your generous donations, we can invest in growth of the Faculty as a thought leader in research and education. I assure you that we will use your donations wisely and with purpose and I hope we can turn to you for ongoing support in the future.

"The research funding has allowed me to complete my work looking into the use of 3D printed porous titanium for bone plates/implants to improve the production and performance of patient specific customised bone implants.

The ability to produce a product to fit only the patient's anatomy, improve on the biocompatibility and mechanical performance of the implants and yet making it lighter by being able to design specific porosities to also aid integration of these implants with bone is relatively new.

These newer advances are part of the 4th Industrial Revolution which encompasses multifront advances in technology, advanced materials, 3D printing and advanced manufacturing."

"Oral mucositis (OM) is a painful and an undesirable side effect of cancer therapy and affect approximately 40% of patients receiving chemotherapy, and 100% of those undergoing head and neck radiotherapy. There is growing interest in the applicability of probiotics in OM in view of its preliminary benefits shown in intestinal mucositis.

The donation of \$10,000 enabled the conduct of a pilot randomized controlled clinical study to evaluate the therapeutic efficacy of Lactobacillus reuteri for OM in patients undergoing head and neck radiotherapy.

Favourable results from this study will pave the way for industrial funding to support larger clinical trials and allow us to be recognized as one of the first groups to provide clinical data for probiotics in the management of cancer therapy-induced OM"
