Implant replacement is a predictable replacement option for missing teeth. Given the commercialisation of implant dentistry, fewer teeth are being saved while more teeth are being extracted to place implants. However, with more emerging evidence of peri-implant diseases and their related complications, are implants always the best option to replace periodontally compromised teeth?

“To extract or to save?” This lecture and sharing session aims to discuss considerations to prognosticate periodontally involved teeth, limitations of periodontal treatment and when these teeth may be indicated for extraction. We will look at literature evidence and cases to help navigate this decision-making process. Through the series of ITI lectures, our goal is to promote holistic implant treatment planning and patient management.
