Speaker Profile

Since November 1, 2024, Professor Dr. med. Dr. dent. Andreas Fichter has headed the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) at Leipzig University Hospital. The 45-year-old maxillofacial surgeon was from the TUM University Hospital Rechts der Isar in Munich. He has moved to Leipzig to head the team at the university's Clinic for Oral and Maxillofacial and Plastics Facial Surgery on Liebigstrasse.

Prof Andreas Fichter brings a comprehensive and diverse surgical spectrum to the Leipzig location from his many years of experience in the renowned Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Technical University of Munich. His expertise enables him to seamlessly continue the proven, broad focus of oral, maxillofacial, and plastic facial surgery at the University Hospital Leipzig and further develop it through innovative procedures.

A central focus of his work is the surgical treatment of head and neck tumours, particularly the treatment of patients with oral carcinoma. In addition to state-of-the-art supermicrosurgical techniques such as perforator flap transplantation, which enable particularly gentle tissue harvesting for microvascular reconstructions, Prof Fichter has extensive experience in complex bony reconstructions, which become necessary when the tumour has infiltrated the upper or lower jaw. He utilises state-of-the-art technology: In the clinic, operations are individually simulated for each patient using computer-assisted planning (CAD/CAM) and implemented with the utmost precision in the operating room.

Lecture Synopsis

In this lecture, current and innovative ideas of oral and maxillofacial trauma will be discussed.
